Qualification specification

Qualification purpose

This qualification is designed to develop and assess the competent performance of those involved in the grading and moderation of vocational assessment, so they have the necessary skills, knowledge and understanding to work effectively in their role.

On achievement of the qualification practitioners will have developed the competence to perform consistently and reliably, to meet the regulatory requirements of valid grading and moderation of vocational assessment. Those wishing to lead moderation activities also have the option to qualify in leading the moderation of graded assessment.

This qualification will support progression of learners to:

- entry into assessment/internal quality assurance roles in the learning and skills industry
- level 4 vocational qualifications in education and training
- level 4 vocational qualifications in external quality assurance of assessment
- increased responsibility in learning and skills management roles

Qualification coverage

The qualification covers mandatory knowledge and understanding of the principles and practices of grading and moderating vocational assessment. It also covers optional skills and knowledge including, carrying out grading and moderation or leading the moderation of graded assessment.

Qualification Objective

Qualification objective: supporting a role in the workplace.

Who is this qualification for?

This qualification is designed for Vocational Assessors who are involved in the grading of assessment and contribute to the moderation of graded assessment. Vocational Assessors include those that assess vocational qualifications and those that carry out the End-point Assessment of Apprenticeship Standards. It is also designed for Internal Quality Assurers who are involved in leading the moderation of vocational assessment processes and practice. They work in Awarding Organisation's approved centres often located within colleges, universities, learning providers or businesses.



Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for learners selecting this qualification. However, the achievement of a level 3 qualification in assessment practice may be an advantage to some learners.

Organisations providing training and assessment must ensure that learners have the potential and opportunity to achieve the qualification successfully.

This qualification is not approved for use by learners under the age of 19 years and OAL cannot accept any registrations for learners in this age group.

Qualification achievement

This qualification is an Award requiring the achievement of 11 credits and is made up of one mandatory and one optional unit of assessment. The units are allocated a credit value which provides an indication of the size of the unit in terms of learning hours, 1 credit = 10 learning hours. The units also have assigned Guided Learning Hours (GLH), which indicate the average number of hours a learner may require guidance and support from teaching, learning and assessment professionals to achieve the unit.

The units of assessment set out Learning Outcomes which describe what learners need to be able to do and understand. The Learning Outcomes are defined by Assessment Criteria which are used to assess competence, expressed as skills achieved and learned knowledge and understanding, to achieve the units. Achievement of the one mandatory unit and one optional unit will mean the qualification has been completed, and will be subject to approval of a claim for certification. OAL will issue a certificate complete with the learner's name, the qualification and unit titles and the credits achieved.
